President Neseth observed Open Meeting Law requirements.

Moved by Kloepping, seconded by Brooks, to approve the 2024-2025 school calendar as presented. Ayes: Kloepping, McConville, Brooks, and Neseth. Nays: None. Absent: O'Dea and Teter. Motion carried.

Moved by McConville, seconded by Kloepping, to approve the quote from Creative Sites for the purchase of elementary play-ground equipment at a cost of \$39,500.00 with thanks to the Southwest Schools Foundation for their donation of \$6,500.00 to purchase a slide. President Neseth closed executive session at 8:13 p.m.

Moved by Kloepping, seconded by Brooks, to renew a contract with Matt Springer with a 3% increase in pay as the junior-senior high school principal and transportation director for the 2024-2025 school year. Ayes: McConville, Neseth, Kloepping, and Brooks. Nays: None. Absent: Teter and O'Dea. Motion carried.

Superintendent Billeter discussed an increase in interest rates for the Certificates of Deposit Account Registry Service at the Stockmens Bank and the Adams Bank & Trust, the resignation of Shelby Chartier as a paraeducator at the junior-senior high school and hiring of MacKayla Collins as her replacement, status of delivery of the purchased bus, letters of intent for certified staff, advertising for instructors, Kindergarten Roundup, and delivery of new welders using the Nebraska Career Education Grant.

During Public Comment, Derek Meyers voiced several questions and comments to the Board.
