That was our school statement to kids prior to taking the MAPS test. Students' were challenged to increase their scores in three of the four areas. Well, it worked and we had 116 students out of the 6-12 grade improve. So as promised we will be taking a half of a day to go Bowling and have a Pizza Party. This was an 88 percent improvement from last fall. I was very proud of the kids and the determination they had to increase their scores.

This year our students were tested in academic areas with the use of the maps test. The students have taken the MAPS test for the second time this year. Those results will be used to determine student progress and identify areas of weakness with individual students. This information can then be processed to help teachers design lessons to target the areas students need to improve. Our overall test scores this year showed some great improvements. I feel that with our great staff working with the kids we have been able to ensure the students are steadily improving.

I have had several calls regarding "Option enrolment". We have closed our option this year and the board has placed a cap on the class sizes for the elementary at 20 and the High school at 40. This does not mean that your child will NOT be able to attend if they are already optioned in. This is only for new students looking to attend our school next year.

We are now in our last month and a half of the school and things are busy around the school. The students will be competing in interscholastic competitions. These are competitions that allow our students to show how much they have learned in their academic classes. Students may also win scholarships to various college institutions if they perform well on the test.

Moved by Brooks, seconded by O'dea, to approve offering all returning teachers a contract for the 2023-2024 school year as

Moved by O'Dea, seconded by McConville, to approve placing surplus items for sale through public auction at Holbrook on April 1, 2023. Ayes: Teter, Kloepping, McConville, O'Dea, and Brooks. Nays: None. Absent: Neseth. Motion carried.

Moved by O'Dea, seconded by Kloepping, to reaffirm Policy #5052 School Wellness. Ayes: Teter, Kloepping, McConville, O'Dea, and Brooks. Nays: None. Absent: Neseth. Motion carried.

Moved by O'Dea, seconded by Kloepping, to approve the resignation of Hannah Ash, 6-12 Art Teacher and Miranda Teel, Kindergarten Teacher. The board thanked them for their years of service. Ayes: Teter, Kloepping, McConville, O'Dea, Neseth, and Brooks. Nays: None. Motion carried.

Mrs. Fries explained the schedule for the March 15 and 16 External Team Review and invited the board to view the team's presentation that is available on the school's website.

Superintendent Porter discussed with the board the transfer of the school house to the Billiter family in the month of June and what the move out and move in process may involve.

Principal Springer reported the Jr/Sr High school has came up with some different incentives to help motivate students to excel when taking MAPS Tests, ACT Tests, and NSCAS tests. Currently the students are taking MAPS Tests and if the student improves in 3 out of the 4 areas they will get to partake in bowling and pizza in McCook. Mr. Springer informed the board the bus that was purchased in October of 2022 should be delivered in November of 2023.

Principal Fries informed the board of the Family Literacy Night that will be held on Monday, March 20<sup>th</sup> at the Jr/Sr High Building in the HS Gym. The juggler with the yellow shoes will be entertaining students and parents from 6:30pm to 7:30 pm. Mrs. Fries reported the Southwest Public Schools Foundation will be holding a meal prior to the event from 5:30 pm to 6:30 pm.
