As we head into the holiday season, it is more important than ever to closely monitor your children's health (as well as your own) to attempt to decrease the possibility of exposing others to this virus. Although we have experienced some issues with quarantines and Covid positive cases, the environment at our school has been such that we have been able to keep the large majority of our students immersed in face-to-face learning. We will continue to encourage vigorous hand washing, social distancing at all possible times and strongly encourage wearing masks. Along with the continual sanitation and disinfecting with antivirus foggers in our buildings and busses, we can continue to remain in school. We do not want to go to an all-virtual learning model, and we need your help in this

Our local health department has moved their dial to "red," and this is based on local hospital capacity. It triggers, therefore, limits on numbers for activities, presentations, concerts and programs. Other schools have their own guidelines, as well, so we will see some variances from school to school. For most activities, at this time, we will be looking at parents only or no fans at all. Our number one goal is to keep our kids in school and hope to be able to also provide extracurricular activities that our students need. It is only with the cooperation of the community that this can continue.

As you may have read or heard in news from around the state, some schools are going to strictly on-line learning for the remainder of the semester after Thanksgiving break. Unless we get a directive from The Department of Education, The Commissioner of Education, The Governor, or our local health department, we fully intend to keep our regular schedule for a return to school as normal after Thanksgiving Break on November 30th and continue school until dismissal on December 22<sup>nd</sup>. Second semester would then start on January 6th for students. You will be notified immediately if conditions change.

I commend all of our district employees for facing this problem with grit and determination. It has been draining for everyone, so some safe rest and relaxation is in order. Thanks for all of the support from our community. It is greatly appreciated.

The first semester is coming to a close. With the winter weather setting in, it is important that you remind your children to dress warm. You may be amazed to see the number of students walking the halls in flip flops and shorts. Not what I would consider appropriate winter dress for the cold days. A bus loses heat really fast if the engine is not running or the heater goes bad. So please keep that in mind as you send your child out the door to catch the bus.

Students have and will continue to take semester tests. This year we will test on Monday the 21st and Tuesday the 22nd. Please keep in mind tests are very important and a learning process for the next level of their education. It is important that you help make sure your child is at school on those last few days. If your child cannot be at school during testing times they will be responsible for making those tests up at a later date over the holiday break. These tests will need to be made up prior to starting the second semester. Please contact the school to arrange a time to make up the test between Dec 28, 29, 30 or 31<sup>st</sup>. I will meet the kids at school and administer their test.

A reminder to check your child's grades on the school website. It is simple to do and helps you keep up with your child's education. The teachers keep the student's grades up to date each week if not more often. Your child also has a school email that they can use to communicate with their teachers or coaches if they are ill or if they missed a class for some reason. The teachers are encouraged to check their email regularly each day. This allows your child to get feedback from the teacher if they need help from home.

With the Covid protocols ever changing it is very important that your child keep up on homework. It can be very difficult to catch up if they are quarantined for 14 days.

## News From The AD - Mr. Roggenkamp

Southwest Jr/Sr High School is working diligently to have a winter sports/activity schedule for 2020-2021. Currently, Jr High Wrestling and Jr High Girls Basketball seasons are underway and High School Basketball and Wrestling practices have started. Very soon we will be hosting High School Basketball and Wrestling Events that will look very different with the current DHM and NSAA Guidelines contests must be operated under. Currently, we are restricted to 25% seating capacity for all contests in our Gym and School building for activities. This count includes athletes while they are not participating. Due to the current DHM events at Southwest Public Schools are currently "Parents Only" or "No Fan" events. Each athlete or participant is being asked to submit their list of

parents to create a pass list at the front gate. Only those on the pass list will be allowed to enter the event under the "Parents Only" designation. If our capacity is raised due to changes in DHM, then Southwest may be able to have events that are "Household Only" or "Immediate Family Only". Household only would allow each athlete to create a pass list including all living under the same household as their parents. "Immediate Family Only" would allow each athlete to obtain a limited number of passes for those outside of their household to be included in attending.

To try and alleviate family or fans not being able to view activities, a school Facebook account has been created where events may be streamed.

Links to ballgame access will be posted on the school website and status of activities will be updated weekly to try and inform fans of the current status of an event. Parents and players will be notified of the status of a game through each teams SPORTSYOU app.

Thank you for working with us in the ultimate goal to maintain the opportunity for our students to participate in the activities they want and need as part of the educational process.

President Teter observed Open Meeting Law requirements.

The Board Members' consensus regarding students who are not in school for face-to-face instruction, if that is the model of instruction for the remainder of the school year, were that the student's parents were to file for home-school status with the Nebraska Department of Education if their intent is to remain at home for the second semester.

Superintendent Porter reported on Governor Pete Ricketts press conference regarding the tightening of COVID-19 protocols and the plan to inform patrons of full payment of the school bond two years early and saving the district over half a million dollars.

Principal Springer reported on staff coverage of bus routes, and Principal Fries reported on the virtual Veterans' Day presentation found on the school's website.

Agenda for meetings will be kept continually current and available for public inspection in the office of the Superintendent.
