High School News - Mr. Springer

The first semester has past and student grades are recorded. You should have received your Childs report card by the time you are reading this. If you have not, please call the school. (Or maybe ask your child if they have seen it!)

Scholarships are starting to filter into the office and Mrs. Lewis has worked hard getting info to the kids. I hope as a parent you can sit down and discuss your child's plans after high school. It may not seem important if your student is not a senior, however in the colleges today there are programs that have a waiting list to even get accepted. So it is important to turn in an application prior to the senior year. ACT scores are part of getting accepted and they also hold a lot of weight in local and federal scholarships. Taking the test more than one time has proven, in almost every case, that the student will improve the second and even the third time. One point on the test can mean the difference of a few dollars or a full tuition scholarship. Students are encouraged to take the ACT test twice their junior year and again once in the fall of their senior year.

Reminder that it is important for you to call the school if your child is ill or not going to be in school that day. We will always follow up if a child is reported absent from first hour. Our first concern is the student's well-being in case they were in a wreck or had trouble. So please help us out by calling first thing if they will be absent.

High school credits are important if a child plans on graduating with their class. Failing a class will cause a student to miss out on multiple opportunities as they proceed through high school. The past two summers we have offered summer school for students to get caught up with classes they failed. If your child fails a class he/she will need to be at summer school for 5 weeks starting the first week of June. Classes are Monday through Thursday from 8:30 to 11:30 each week. The credit recovery program we use can be completed 4 weeks if the student works hard. Please call the school if your child fails a class so we can begin the process of getting them started on credit recovery.

7:33 p.m. on December 12, 2022 at the Southwest Junior-Senior High School in Bartley.

Present: Duane Teter, Brooke Brooks, Jennifer McConville, John O'Dea, Superintendent Todd Porter, and Patricia Smith.

Absent: Jason Neseth and Jason Kloepping.

Visitors: None.

President Teter observed Open Meeting Law requirements.

Moved by O'Dea, seconded by Brooks, to excuse absent board members, Neseth and Kloepping. Ayes: Teter, McConville, Brooks, and O'Dea. Nays: None. Absent: Neseth and Kloepping. Motion carried.

Moved by O'Dea, seconded by McConville, to approve the board meeting agenda as presented. Ayes: O'Dea, McConville, Brooks, and Teter. Nays: None. Absent: Neseth and Kloepping. Motion carried. Notice of the meeting was given in advance to all members prior to the meeting date.

The semi-annual review of Covid-19 Protocols and uses of the ARP ESSR III Grant, as posted on the school website, are being used for class size reduction and interventions and was discussed by school board members.

Superintendent Porter discussed the recent safety audit and corrective actions, elementary roof repair status, the hiring of a custodian and cook, and the December 12 elementary math inservice and district safety meeting.

Agenda for meetings will be kept continually current and available for public inspection in the office of the Superintendent.

The next regular board meeting will be held on Monday, January 9, 2023 at 7:30 p.m. at the Southwest Junior-Senior High School Library in Bartley.
