Thursday, May 4th- 7th grade students will be participating in a career exploration day and visit 6 area businesses to learn about careers in Southwest Nebraska.

Essay Contest:

The Nebraska Game and Park Commission is holding the 7th annual Kayak Kid Essay Contest. The contest aims to reward local youth who best express their appreciation for the many outdoor recreational opportunities in our area. We ask students to write a short, 250-word or less essay to answer one question: "What is your most memorable outdoor recreation experience in a southwest Nebraska State Recreation Area (SRA)?"

There are two age divisions, 10-14 years old and 15-18 years old. First-place winners from each age division will be awarded a kayak, paddle, and lifejacket. Fishing rods and reels will be awarded to the second and third-place winners from each age division.

The parks that students are invited to write about include Lake Maloney SRA, Sutherland SRA, Red Willow SRA, Swanson SRA, Medicine Creek SRA, Enders SRA, Rock Creek Lake SRA, Buffalo Bill SRA, Lake Ogallala SRA, and Lake McConaughy SRA.

Essays should be submitted by the end of the day on Wednesday, May 3rd, 2023. Winners will be announced on Wednesday, May 10th, 2023. Students who submit essays, and their families, are invited to an Award Ceremony at the Lake Maloney Outlet SRA, north of the swim area, on Saturday, May 20th, 2023 from 5:00 to 7:00 pm Central Time. The prizes will be awarded at this time. The NGPC kayak and fishing trailers will be provided so families can enjoy the lake together. Food will also be provided free of charge.


