Demographic Information

The Southwest Public School System is a consolidated district that covers approximately 650 square miles of Red Willow, Frontier, and Furnas Counties. A highly qualified and dedicated staff works with the 315 students at the Southwest Public School District. This staff has designed and implemented a curriculum that aligns with the State Standards. The district's student assessment process includes a system of ongoing classroom assessments, NSCAS reading, math, science and writing, a criterion-referenced assessment system known as the Nebraska Online Assessment System, and the NWEA MAPS as a nationally normed referenced test. The ACT test has been recently added for 11th graders to complete the assessment process. These assessments provide the staff with information to review and revise the curriculum, providing students with a learning environment that will assist them throughout life. District 179 is accredited by the Nebraska Department of Education.

- 53% of students qualify for the Federal Free and Reduced Lunch Program.
- 5% are identified as English Language Learners.
- 9% are recognized as High Ability Learners.
- 10% of students have a disability.

NSCAS

The Nebraska Student-Centered Assessment System (NSCAS) is the state test for students in grades 3 through 8, assessing English Language Arts and Mathematics in all grades, and Science in grades 5 and 8. Aligned with Nebraska's state standards, NSCAS is administered primarily online and uses various question types to measure students' mastery of grade-level content. Results help families and educators identify strengths and areas for growth, supporting student learning and instructional decisions.

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School Improvement & Student Success Update

Literacy: Building Strong Foundations for Lifelong Readers

Foundational reading skills continue to be a top district priority. With high teacher engagement and a strong phonological curriculum, our students are gaining the skills needed for long-term success in reading.

✓ Priority Goal: All students will make individual gains in foundational reading.

DIBELS Highlights (Spring 2024):

Kindergarten: 80% at or above grade level
1st Grade: 78% at or above grade level

• **2nd Grade**: 69% at or above grade level

From fall to spring, students well below benchmark decreased in all grades. However, we are continuing targeted support, especially for 1st and 2nd grade students who started the year below benchmark. Our goal remains: for every child to be a confident reader.

Math: Strengthening Number Sense Across All Grades

We are focused on building number sense and fluency to empower confident, capable mathematicians.

✓ Priority Goal: 80% of students will be proficient in number sense.

Math Proficiency Snapshot:

Grade 3 MAPS: 79% Proficient
Grade 4 MAPS: 56% Proficient
Grade 5 MAPS: 75% Proficient

NSCAS Results:

Grade 4: 71% On TrackGrade 5: 65% On Track

Middle School MAPS Growth (Fall 2023–Spring 2024):

6th Grade: 13/15 met growth goals
7th Grade: 16/22 met growth goals
8th Grade: 21/28 met growth goals

→ 77% of students in grades 6–8 demonstrated growth!

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While proud of this growth, we continue to address fundamental skill gaps through daily fluency practice and intervention.

High School Success in Reading & Math

High school students are making substantial gains across core subjects.

✓ Priority Goal: 80% of students proficient in English Language Arts and number sense.

ELA MAPS (Grades 9–12):

- 60–80% of students are above the 50th percentile
- Goal: All students perform at or above the 61st percentile and show growth

Math MAPS (Grades 9–12):

- 73% at or above benchmark
- 27% working toward proficiency
- Goal: 80% at benchmark by year-end

Collaboration, Support & Professional Growth
